From the Rabbi's Scroll



My favorite memories of Purim when my daughters were young were dressing up and imagining that we were other people, acting as if we were characters from another person's life. We wore masks to hide our usual identity, something I feel we do metaphorically, regularly in our daily lives.

The story of Purim is recounted in the Book of Esther, whose well-known heroine, plays the leading role in saving her people from a massacre planned by the book's villain, Haman. The word Purim means "lots" and refers to the mechanism by which Haman chose the date for the Jews' destruction. The holiday is traditionally celebrated with wild

abandon—costumes, drinking, feasting, revelry—and by reading the Megillah and giving gifts to friends and the poor.

Some of the questions that I ponder when I think of Purim's message for us today are: What masks do we wear each day? How do we hide our real selves and why is that the case? Are there ways we can become more comfortable in our own skin that will benefit us?

Other questions are as follows: Are we more like Mordechai, who saw danger and immediately took steps to rectify the situation, or are we more like Esther, who initially declined Mordechai's plea to get involved in the efforts to save the Jewish People? Much like Moses, who minimized his capacity to enact real change, Esther did not think that she had what it took. She thought she would be safer masking her identity as a Jewish woman. She thought she could hide in the palace. Moses hid in the palace until he found he could no longer watch as his People suffered. Esther came to the same realization.

To me, Purim is clearly about having fun and being silly. It is also quite clearly about key people working diligently to change the course of history. They worked hard to ensure the Jewish people would survive. They chose action, not silence. We must do the same. We clearly must relish lighter moments at Temple even while carrying the intensity of what is happening in Israel and elsewhere.

What we cannot do is hide from the reality facing us all as Jewish people.

I look forward to seeing you at our Purim celebration on Friday, March 14th at 6pm. Rena Stober will be back to add singing and levity to the service, the Shpiel and the Megillah reading.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed to this meaningful initiative. Your generosity has truly made a difference.


