We are excited to celebrate the upcoming Bar Mitzvah of Chance Stastny, who will be called to the Torah on January 17th. Chance is 13 years old and lives in Brea with his parents, Cynthia and Michael, and his older sister, Alexandria. He is a seventh grader at Orange County School of the Arts, where he is part of the Commercial Dance Program.

Chance has been dancing since the age of three and has studied a wide variety of styles, including ballet, hip hop, jazz, contemporary, modern, and lyrical. He previously trained in the Cecchetti Method of Ballet, but his favorite style is hip hop. Over the past two years, Chance has competed as a soloist at dance competitions throughout Southern California. He currently dances and competes at Stage One Dance Studio in Brea.

When he's not dancing, Chance enjoys another favorite pastime: collecting Pokémon cards. He also loves being outgoing and helping people. Chance shared:



"I want to make a difference directly to my community plus I love talking to people."

For his mitzvah project, Chance visits homebound seniors to bring companionship, conversation, and a little extra joy to their day. He chose this project because it combines what matters most to him: helping others and building relationships. One of the seniors he regularly visits is Fran, with whom he spends time listening to stories about her life and sharing meaningful conversations about her experiences and memories.

TBO has always been a place where Chance feels welcomed. He and his family have been Temple members since 2014. From a very young age, Chance has loved being on the bimah and helping to lead services with Rabbi Mark Goldfarb, and he continues to enjoy doing so with Rabbi Len Muroff.

Chance is grateful for the patience, encouragement, and support he has received throughout his Jewish learning and Bar Mitzvah preparation. He is especially thankful to Alyssa, who taught him to read Hebrew, and to Mrs. Millhander, who helped him learn the Hebrew prayers. As he looks ahead to his Bar Mitzvah, Chance shared, "I would like to thank Rabbi Muroff, Alyssa and all my religious schoolteachers for their patience and teachings to prepare me for my Bar Mitzvah."



# **Security Fence Project Update**

## From Co-chairs of Safety and Security: Douglas Kotkin & Sergio Sanchez-Gutzman

We would like to share an update on the proposed security fence project that we introduced earlier this year.

In 2024, Temple Beth Ohr applied for the California Non-Profit Security Grant (CSNSGP), which provides funding to help religious organizations enhance security. In March 2025, we were awarded \$250,000 through this program. Following the award, we were required to wait for a second approval letter authorizing us to spend the funds. During this period, we were permitted to gather bids and documentation, but not to expend grant funds.

In July, the City of La Mirada approved a variance for the wrought iron portion of the fence, including the necessary height adjustment required by the grant. On November 4, 2025, we received the second approval letter, officially authorizing us to proceed with spending the grant funds. We were also notified that we may be reimbursed for contracted security services used beginning in January 2025.

We recently engaged an engineering firm to prepare the required documentation for construction approval from the City of La Mirada and to support the bidding process with five construction firms. We are also obtaining bids from multiple vendors to replace the exterior kitchen and storage room doors.

Demolition work is tentatively planned to begin in early May 2026, with the goal of completing the project before the High Holidays of 2026.

A rendering of the planned fence, along with required sample materials, is currently on display in the TBO foyer. All grant-related decisions are reviewed by a five-member grant subcommittee, with the TBO Board kept informed throughout the process.
