Vayechi
Genesis 47:28-50:26

Vayechi (“He Lived”) is the final Torah portion in the Book of Genesis. It opens as Jacob prepares for his death, making his son Joseph swear to bury him in the Cave of Machpelah in Hebron. At the end of his life, Jacob focuses on his identity as an Israelite in partnership with God. The years in Egypt have brought his family together and created peace, where once there was rupture, yet Jacob knows that his home and his heart are in Israel. It is the land which God had promised Abraham and Sarah. If it is true that "home is where the heart is," then Jacob knows that there is "no place like home." –Rabbi Muroff
