The portion this week seeks to emphasize that we must be so devoted to our religion and our traditions that we are willing to take significant steps to defend Judaism. On the other hand, some rabbis view Pinchas' extreme zealotry as not being something which we should emulate. This week's Torah portion is read on its own, unlike the two portions, before and two after which are generally read together. To this point, one rabbi explained, "the reason is because Pinchas was a zealot, and every zealot is on his own. Woe to the generation whose zealots unite".
